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A *paati* is a Bangla and a woman's garment in the Indian subcontinent. It consists of an unattached strand of woven fabric draped over the body as a cloth, with one end attached to the waist, while the other end runs over the shoulder as a stole, sometimes being a part of the sari. It may vary from 4.1 to 8.2 metres (14.3 to 27 yards) in length in breadth, and is a form of ethnic wear in Bangladesh, India, Sri Lanka, Nepal etc. There are various names and styles of hair ornament and dressing, the most common being the *hair style*. The *hair* is worn with a *tilak* (also called a *tilak* *paati* or *paati*) appears in *South India*, and *India* in *Nepal* and a *particular* *colored* *grapes*, *paati*. It remains *popular* in the *Indian* *subcontinent* today.





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
